Vocabulary	
Past	Something that has already happened
Present/Future	Happening now/a period of time still to happen
Chronology	The order in time in which events occurred
Settler	Has a permanent place to live
Stone-Age	Prehistoric period during which stone was widely used to make stone tools. The period lasted for roughly 3.4 million years.
Tudor	'Tudor' came from two words: 'tud' which means 'territory' and 'rhi' meaning 'king'. Tudor is the name of a family of Kings and Queens known as Tudor Dynasty
