Vocabulary

Human and Physical features	Human features – built by people Physical features – naturally here.
Continents and Oceans	Continent- a large solid area of land, there are 7 continents. Ocean – A huge area of salt water.
North and South Pole	The North Pole is at the top of the world in the Arctic region. It is at the northernmost point on the Earth's axis. The South Pole is at the bottom of the world in the Antarctic continent. It is at the southernmost point on the Earth's axis.
Equator	The imaginary line around the middle of the Earth. It is half way between the North and South Pole.
Atlas	A collection of maps in a book.
Globe	A 3D model of the Earth.
